





## Breakfast Club Update for 2022

Term 2 sees most if not all of what we have previously done – back in action, namely:



- May 6th ... Fun Run with the Glen Innes Police from Mission Bay to St Heliers Bay with Glen Innes and Glen Taylor Year 7 and 8 students.
- May 16th ... we are meeting with Auckland East Rotary in the hope of obtaining funding for the New Entrants initiative we started successfully two years ago.
- June 1st ... Operation Attend is an event with the Glen Innes Police where we are taking large hampers to about 120 families and 200 children that have not attended school close to 12 months. In 2021 we did a similar event with four children and have great success. We have raised \$4,000 for this event and to date on target to obtain about 5,000 items for the hampers.
- Emerging Leaders was started in 2021 with ten year 6 children from Glen Innes and Glen Taylor Schools. We will be planning in 2022 to take these children to a number of events where Business Leaders will address the children.
- July 1st ... Year 7 and 8 children from Glen Innes, Glen Taylor and Panmure District School will be running up Mount Wellington with the Glen Innes Police and being address by Ngati Paua followed by a BBQ put on by the Police.
