Keep Awake

Scripture reading: Matthew 25:1-13 (New International Version)



The Parable of the Ten Virgins

25 "At that time the kingdom of heaven will be like ten virgins who took their lamps and went out to meet the bridegroom. ² Five of them were foolish and five were wise. ³ The foolish ones took their lamps but did not take any oil with them. ⁴ The wise ones, however, took oil in jars along with their lamps. ⁵ The bridegroom was a long time in coming, and they all became drowsy and fell asleep.

⁶ "At midnight the cry rang out: 'Here's the bridegroom! Come out to meet him!'

⁷ "Then all the virgins woke up and trimmed their lamps. ⁸ The foolish ones said to the wise, 'Give us some of your oil; our lamps are going out.'

⁹ "'No,' they replied, 'there may not be enough for both us and you. Instead, go to those who sell oil and buy some for yourselves.'

¹⁰ "But while they were on their way to buy the oil, the bridegroom arrived. The virgins who were ready went in with him to the wedding banquet. And the door was shut.

¹¹ "Later the others also came. 'Lord, Lord,' they said, 'open the door for us!'

¹² "But he replied, 'Truly I tell you, I don't know you.'

¹³ "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know the day or the hour.

Pastoral Reflection

Hello, friends, who love St Johns,

This is week's gospel reading is the beginning of four consecutive parables Matthew records as a part of Jesus' final discourse. Brace yourself because I believe these few readings are going to be very challenging for us. I personally struggle with this week's parable. Every time I read it; it provokes awkward and uncomfortable questions for me: why do the bridesmaids have to bring their own light to a wedding reception? Why are the "wise" bridesmaids stingy and mean? Why doesn't the groom show up for his own wedding until midnight? Why does the bride — whoever she is — put up with such a ridiculous delay? Where even *is* the bride in this story? And why, after keeping his poor bridesmaids waiting for hours, does the groom blame *them* for lateness — and shut his door in their faces? If the flaw of the bridesmaids is not that they fell asleep why are they told to keep awake?

All the awkward and challenging elements, however, help to heighten the contrast between the wise and the foolish bridesmaids. Five have prepared for the delay of the bridegroom by bringing sufficient supply of oil, while the five have not. The last-mentioned group want to attend the wedding celebration. They are friends of the bridegroom.

Yet when they return from their search for oil and call out, "Lord, Lord, open to us," they are rejected as if they were strangers. "Truly I tell you, I do not know you."

This exchange between the foolish bridesmaids and the bridegroom brings to mind Jesus' words towards the end of the Sermon on the Mount:

"Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father who is in heaven. ²² Many will say to me on that day, 'Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and in your name perform many miracles?' ²³ Then I will tell them plainly, 'I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!'


With that connection in mind what do you intuit is the main point of the parable? Also, with that connection in mind what does "keep awake" imply then?
