

Scripture reading: Matthew 23:1-12 (New International Version)



A Warning Against Hypocrisy

23 Then Jesus said to the crowds and to his disciples: ² "The teachers of the law and the Pharisees sit in Moses' seat. ³ So you must be careful to do everything they tell you. But do not do what they do, for they do not practice what they preach. ⁴ They tie up heavy, cumbersome loads and put them on other people's shoulders, but they themselves are not willing to lift a finger to move them.

⁵ "Everything they do is done for people to see: They make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long; ⁶ they love the place of honor at banquets and the most important seats in the synagogues; ⁷ they love to be greeted with respect in the marketplaces and to be called 'Rabbi' by others.

⁸ "But you are not to be called 'Rabbi,' for you have one Teacher, and you are all brothers. ⁹ And do not call anyone on earth 'father,' for you have one Father, and he is in heaven. ¹⁰ Nor are you to be called instructors, for you have one Instructor, the Messiah. ¹¹ The greatest among you will be your servant. ¹² For those who exalt themselves will be humbled, and those who humble themselves will be exalted.

Pastoral Reflection

Hello, friends, who love St Johns,

The gospel reading this week creeps up on us somehow. Over and over again we assume that the gospel reading is about other people, especially about the Pharisees who seemed to be standing in opposition to what Jesus was about – their lives were incongruent with their words. But then suddenly we are woken up by a word and/or phrase from the reading and we can no longer stay passive, or uninvolved because we can hear our names being called out...

As the narrative turns to speak to us directly, what we discover is that the behaviour of the Pharisees was only illustrative, and that the real point of Matthew 23 is not to condemn the religious leaders of Jesus' day, but instead the gospel reading is aimed at Christian leaders and us who are gathered here today at St Johns.


