
A very warm welcome is extended to all visitors to St Johns. Morning tea is offered after the service today, so please stay and enjoy.

Pastoral Reflection

Happy New Year, friends who love St Johns,

Isaiah begins his ministry among the exiles in Babylon. He sees the coming of Cyrus whom God "stirred up" (Isaiah 41: 25) following chaotic power struggles. Isaiah senses that God is about to do something new. Jerusalem has fallen, as Jeremiah had prophesied. But God who is the incarnated one has not fallen. God is about to restore his people in a new way.

And so, Isaiah says, remember not the former things, nor consider the things of old. Behold, I am doing a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I wonder if that is the invitation for us this year as people gathered at St Johns. I wonder if God is inviting us to forget the forget the former things – you can fill in the blanks. But then God invite us to bear witness to the in breaking of a newness, because it is springing forth, do we have hearts to perceive what God is doing in and among us?



Our monthly Community Dinner happens on the 1st Monday of each month:


