Happy New Year



Seasons greetings, friends who love St Johns,

As the year begins, I have a couple of questions for us to reflect on. What difference does Christmas (and by Christmas, I mean Christ coming into your live) make? What motivates you? In other words, what is it that compels you?

Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 5:14-21:

¹⁴ For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced that one died for all, and therefore all died. ¹⁵ And he died for all, that those who live should no longer live for themselves but for him who died for them and was raised again. ¹⁶ So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. Though we once regarded Christ in this way, we do so no longer. ¹⁷ Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here! ¹⁸ All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ and gave us the ministry of reconciliation: ¹⁹ that God was reconciling the world to himself in Christ, not counting people's sins against them. And he has committed to us the message of reconciliation. ²⁰ We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God. ²¹ God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

What Paul is saying is that it is the love of Christ that motivates us. Also, because Christ has come and died, everything is different now. We are different, and we engage with reality differently now. We have a different frame of reference and with different set of lenses. We see people differently, we reconcile, and we treat each as image bearers.

Is this your reality to? Is the love of Christ the thing that motivates you? What do you sense is your invitation in the year 2024?

Scripture reading: Mark 1:4-11 (New Revised Standard Version)



Mark 1:4-11

⁴ so John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. ⁵ And the whole Judean region and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him and were baptized by him in the River Jordan, confessing their sins. ⁶ Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. ⁷ He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the strap of his sandals. ⁸ I have baptized you with ^[f] water, but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

⁹ In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. ¹⁰ And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove upon him. ¹¹ And a voice came from the heavens, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased."

John 1:1-18, Psalm 29:1-2 (New International Version)

Theme: The Glory of God Revealed



The Word Became Flesh

- 1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was with God in the beginning. 3 Through him all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made. 4 In him was life, and that life was the light of all mankind. 5 The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.
- **6** There was a man sent from God whose name was John. **7** He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through him all might believe. **8** He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light.
- **9** The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. **10** He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. **11** He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him. **12** Yet to all who did receive him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God— **13** children born not of natural descent, nor of human decision or a husband's will, but born of God.
- **14** The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the one and only Son, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth.
- **15** (John testified concerning him. He cried out, saying, "This is the one I spoke about when I said, 'He who comes after me has surpassed me because he was before me.'") **16** Out of his fullness we have all received grace in place of grace already given. **17** For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. **18** No one has ever seen God, but the one and only Son, who is himself God and is in closest relationship with the Father, has made him known.

¹⁹ When he had gone a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John in a boat, preparing their nets. ²⁰ Without delay he called them, and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men and followed him.

The Julian calendar is the one that was introduced in the year 46 BC by Julius Caesar to all of the Roman Empire, and it is the calendar that was used during the life of Jesus Christ and at the time of the early Church The Gregorian calendar is the calendar used in most parts of the world. It went into effect in October 1582 following the papal bull Intergravissimas issued by Pope Gregory XIII, which introduced it as a modification of, and replacement for, the Julian calendar


The Gregorian calendar, like the Julian calendar, is a solar calendar with 12 months of 28-31 days each. The year in both calendars consists of 365 days, with a leap day being added to to February in the leap years. The months and Irength of months in the Gregorian calendar are the same as for the Julian calendar.

Overview of Jesus' life






Jesus can be placed within the geographic, historical, political and social context of the small area of the Near East where he lived and taught. The story charts the journey of the Holy Family to Bethlehem, where Jesus was born; the flight into Egypt to escape Herod's Massacre of the Innocents; the return from Egypt to Nazareth and the Sea of Galilee, where Jesus began his ministry; and finally, the journry of Jesus and his followers to Jerusalem, where he would be crucified by the Romans. Apart from his babyhood in Egypt and a brief sojourn in the Gentile settlements of Tyre and Sidon (now in modern-day Lebanon), Jesus spent the whole of his short life in the narrow strip of land bordering the western shore of the Jordan River, bounded to the north by Galilee and its sea and to the south by Jerusalem. The whole distance from north to south was only about 70 miles (110 km).
