

Jesus Clears the Temple Courts

13 When it was almost time for the Jewish Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem. 14 In the temple courts he found people selling cattle, sheep and doves, and others sitting at tables exchanging money. 15 So he made a whip out of cords, and drove all from the temple courts, both sheep and cattle; he scattered the coins of the money changers and overturned their tables. 16 To those who sold doves he said, "Get these out of here! Stop turning my Father's house into a market!" 17 His disciples remembered that it is written: "Zeal for your house will consume me."

- 18 The Jews then responded to him, "What sign can you show us to prove your authority to do all this?"
- 19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."
- 20 They replied, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and you are going to raise it in three days?" 21 But the temple he had spoken of was his body. 22 After he was raised from the dead, his disciples recalled what he had said. Then they believed the scripture and the words that Jesus had spoken.

Pastoral Reflection

Hello, friends, who love St Johns,

Welcome to our Third Sunday in Lent. The lectionary passage for this week is not found in Mark's gospel but in John's gospel. I am not sure the reasons for this switch, but I trust the wisdom of the Church of moving our attention from Mark's gospel to John's gospel. In the middle of John's gospel reading for this week there is this line, 19 Jesus answered them, "Destroy this temple, and I will raise it again in three days."

Essentially Jesus says, "destroy the church and raise it again." I wonder what emotions those words evoke in you? For some of us we welcome the action of destroying the church. Because we have witnessed its corruption and abuse, and we would like a makeover. But for some of us we are going-Jesus are you out of your mind? Have you seen the majesty and the beauty of our Cathedrals? Jesus what are you smoking?

I suspect, those are the emotions present in our gospel reading this week. Some people gathered would have welcomed Jesus' desire to destroy the temple because it had become a symbol of exclusion and exploitation, and they welcomed the possibility of setting everything right again. But for some this was not a welcomed proposition.


