Scripture reading: John 10:11-18 (New International Version)



¹¹ "I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep. So when he sees the wolf coming, he abandons the sheep and runs away. Then the wolf attacks the flock and scatters it. ¹³ The man runs away because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep.

¹⁴ "I am the good shepherd; I know my sheep and my sheep know me— ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father—and I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other sheep that are not of this sheep pen. I must bring them also. They too will listen to my voice, and there shall be one flock and one shepherd. ¹⁷ The reason my Father loves me is that I lay down my life—only to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down and authority to take it up again. This command I received from my Father."

Pastoral Reflection

Hello, friends, who love St Johns,

Welcome to our fourth Sunday of Eastertide.

In this week's Gospel, John is using the metaphor of shepherding in a way of talking about the leadership in Israel. The answer to bad leadership is not no leadership. The answer to bad leadership is good leadership. Jesus is the good shepherd that Israel had been hoping for.

In our fourth Sunday in Easter, what is on offer is a different version of leadership different from the one expressed by the leaders in Israel at the time of Jesus. John describes a leader who "lays down his life". A leader who in effect places his body in danger for the sake of those he/she has under their care. This is a leader who display courage and integrity. A leader who is willing to give themselves away for the sake of the people they have under their care. A leader who is not self-interested.
