


Sunday 28-Apr-2024

Scripture reading: John 15:1-8 (New International Version)



15 "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. <sup>2</sup> He cuts off every branch in me that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful. <sup>3</sup> You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. <sup>4</sup> Remain in me, as I also remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me.

<sup>5</sup> "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing. <sup>6</sup> If you do not remain in me, you are like a branch that is thrown away and withers; such branches are picked up, thrown into the fire and burned. <sup>7</sup> If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. <sup>8</sup> This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit, showing yourselves to be my disciples.

### **Pastoral Reflection**

Hello, friends, who love St Johns,

Welcome to our fifth Sunday of Eastertide.

This week's Gospel reading is full of imageries. We will delve into each of them on Sunday, but for now I want to focus this reflection on one of the imageries – Abide.

In this passage Jesus seems to be focusing on us abiding why? Because Jesus wants to reveal to us the God who wants to abide with us.

"Remain – Abide (meinate – from Meno) in me, and I in you". The verb, Meno, in its various forms, occurs in a number of passages in John's gospel. Jesus says, "He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives (menei) in me, and I in him (John 6:56) – and Remain (meinete) in me, and I in you. Just as the branch can't bear fruit by itself unless it remains (mene) in the vine, so neither can you unless you remain (mentee) on me (John 15:4) – and as the Father has loved me, I also have loved you. Remain (meinate) in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain (meneite) in my love; even as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain (meno) in his love (John 15:9-10).

It is also significant that the Holy Spirit at the Jesus' baptism remains (meno) on Jesus. The verb, meno, as I have demonstrated occurs frequently in the gospel of John. It describes a relationship that is deep and abiding rather than trivial or passing. Jesus has a deep and abiding relationship with the Spirit, and that's the kind of relationship Jesus invites the disciples to. In other words, abiding – staying - meno is describing a relational dynamic.
