Love Each Other

⁹ "As the Father has loved me, so have I loved you. Now remain in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commands, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love. ¹¹ I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and that your joy may be complete. ¹² My command is this: Love each other as I have loved you. ¹³ Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command. ¹⁵ I no longer call you servants, because a servant does not know his master's business. Instead, I have called you friends, for everything that I learned from my Father I have made known to you. ¹⁶ You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you so that you might go and bear fruit—fruit that will last—and so that whatever you ask in my name the Father will give you. ¹⁷ This is my command: Love each other.

Pastoral Reflection

Hello, friends, who love St Johns, Welcome to our sixth Sunday of Eastertide.

I have been having some good conversations with people who have recently joined our community. Their generosity of spirit and passion for our community has been very encouraging and life giving to me. I am so looking forward to Pentecost Sunday (May 19th, 2024) when we will have the opportunity to formally induct the new members into our community. For our Welcoming Service on Pentecost, Colenso and Rona have gifted us a way for us to welcome the new members. It is going to be a beautiful welcoming space where will get to hear each other's stories and a chance to exercise generosity and hospitality with each other as we welcome the first fruits on Pentecost Sunday.

This week's Gospel reading is describing what fruitfulness is in the kingdom of God. In this Gospel reading, fruitfulness in the kingdom of God is defined in a relational dynamic.
